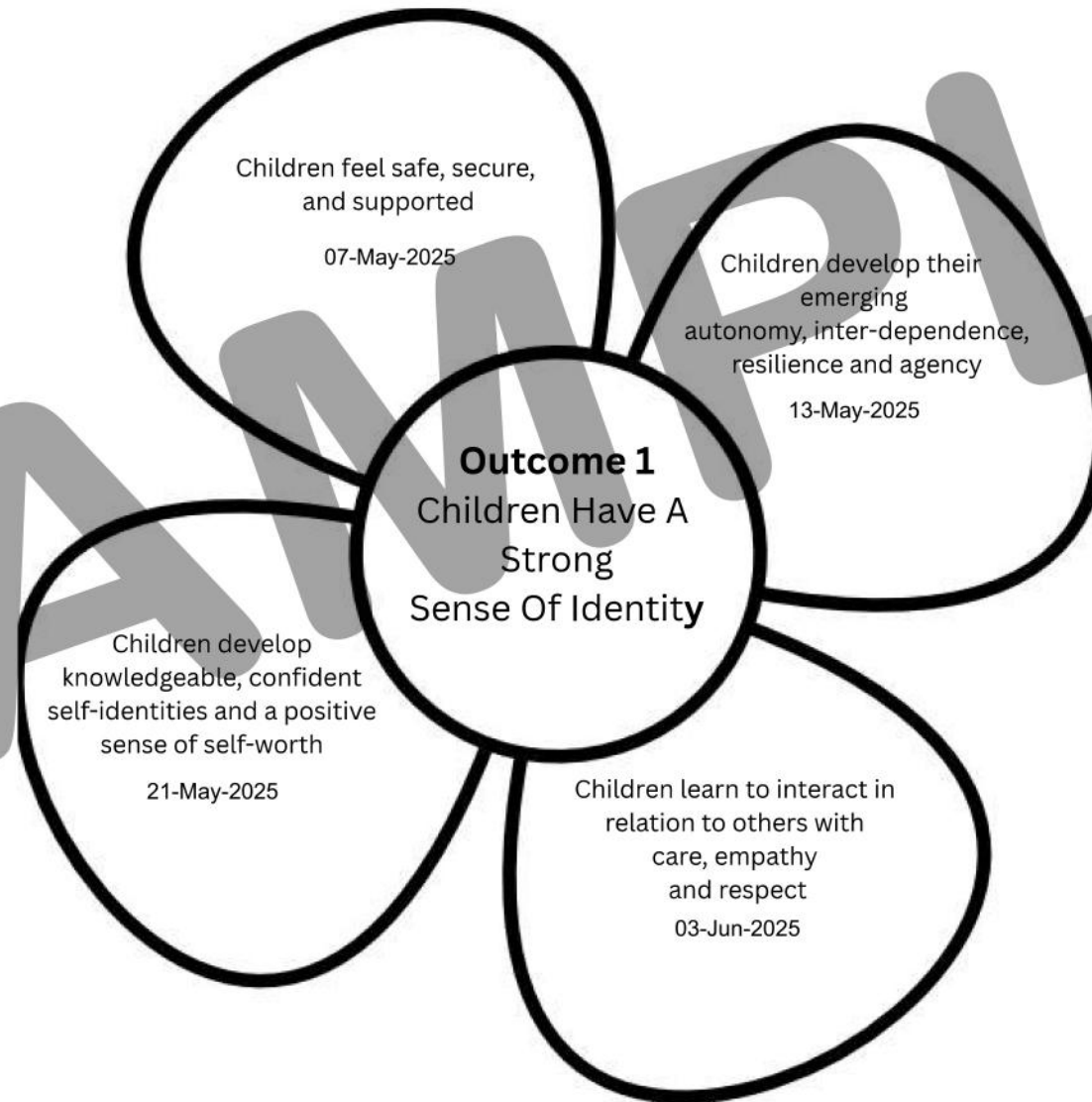

Children feel safe, secure, and supported as they build confidence in who they are. They learn to express themselves, form relationships, and explore their place in the world.

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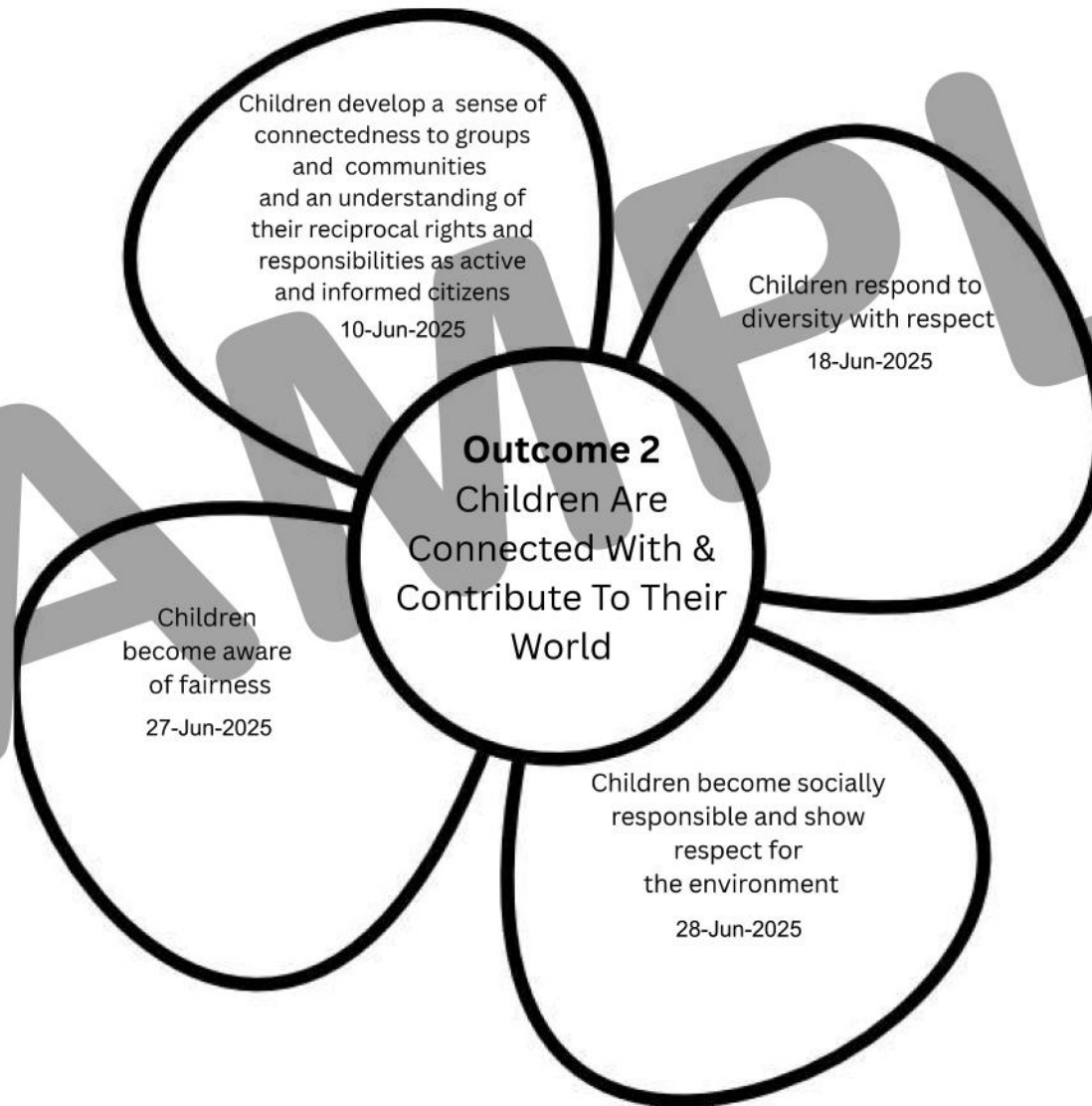




## Outcome 2 – Children Are Connected With & Contribute To Their World

Children develop a sense of belonging by engaging with their community, culture, and environment. They learn to respect others, share ideas, and work together with empathy and care.

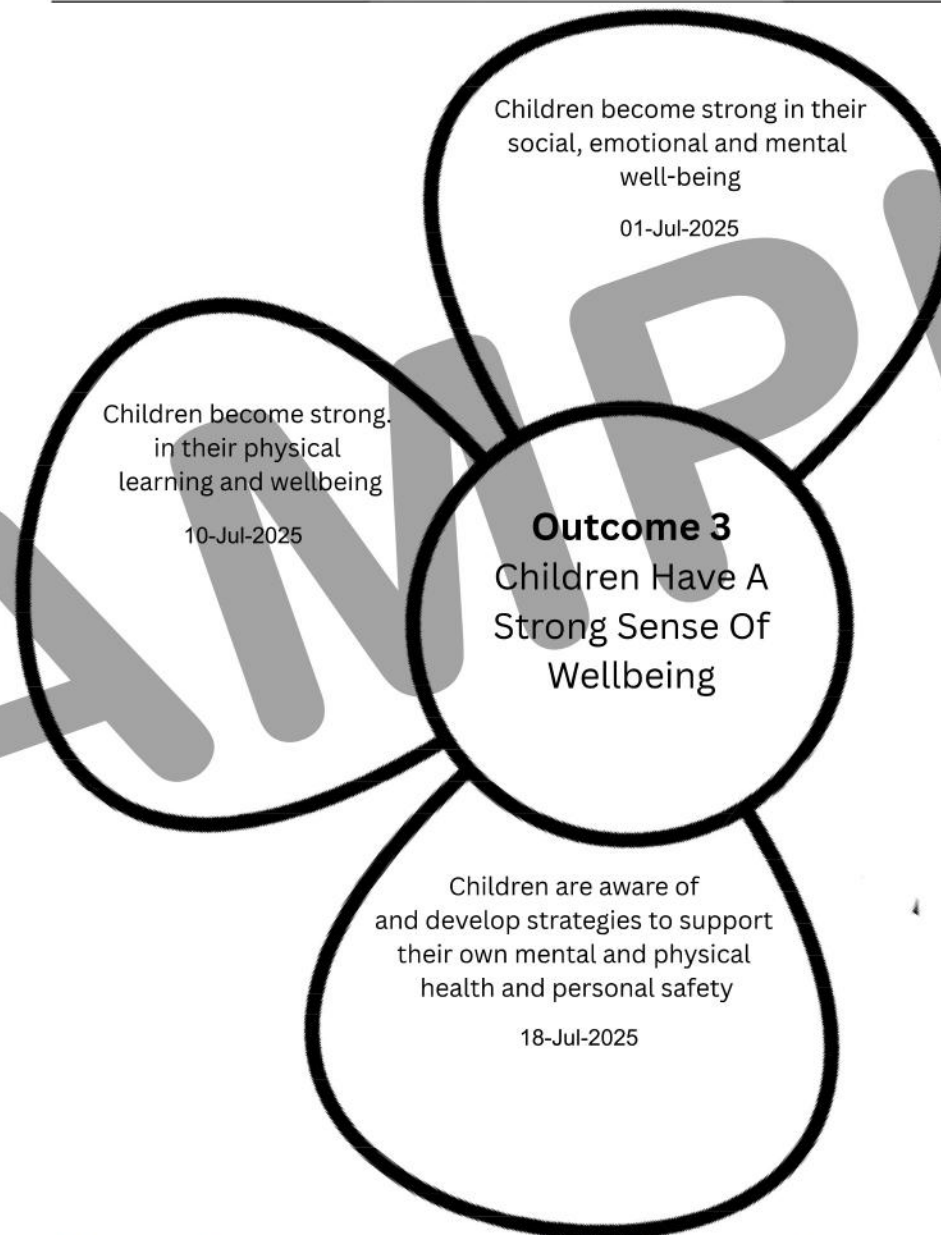
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## Outcome 3 – Children Have A Strong Sense Of Wellbeing

Children build physical and emotional well-being through active play, self-regulation, and healthy habits. They learn to manage emotions, take risks safely, and develop resilience.

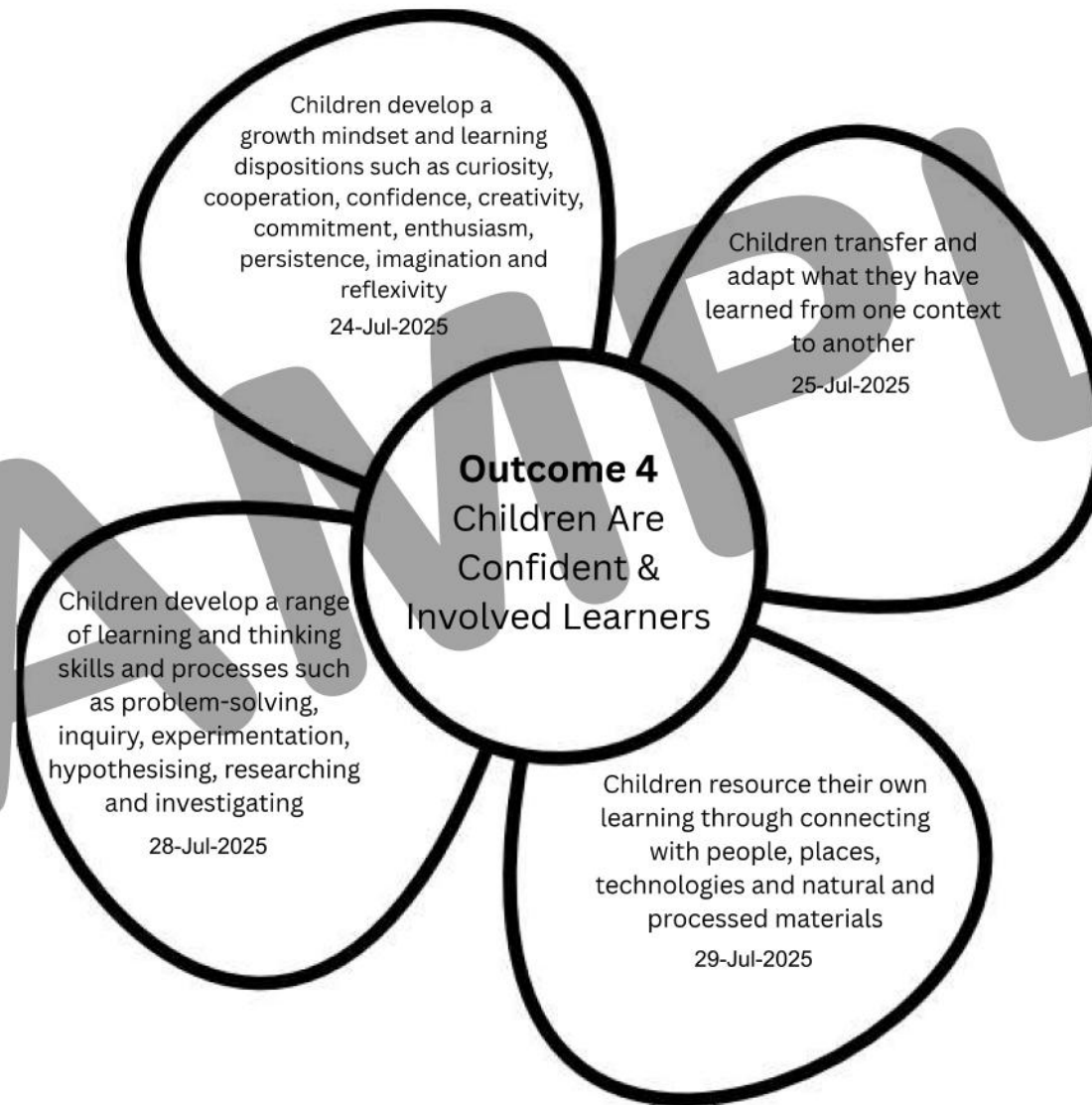
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## Outcome 4 – Children Are Confident & Involved Learners
