- A strong sense of wellbeing
- Confidence and involvement in their learning
- Effective communication skills

Educator Message

Educator Comments

Maya is a confident and happy girl. She enjoys her time at the service and has become quite confident in the learning environment, Maya is beginning to understand her behavior and the consequences of her actions. She will openly express her ideas and puts her ideas into action during play. Maya enjoys engaging in dramatic play and uses different role play to express herself, what she has observed and what she is familiar with e.g playing "mummy" by putting her baby to bed or taking Mr Rabbit in the pram to go shopping to buy apples from the shop. Maya is displays confidence and trust in us which enables her to explore and learn.

Child's Comments

"I like playing with my dolly and pretending to go shopping and buy vegetables from the lady with the computer. I'm a doctor too. Elephant is sneezing and has a fever so I use a stethoscope to check his heart. He needs medicine to get better. Elephant is resting. I have a sore tummy, I need an operation I have a cyst like amma (mummy). Doctor gives me injection it doesn't hurt I'm strong. I wake up and now all better. Look at my stitches".

Educator Comments

Maya enjoys participating in cultural events and celebrations at the service. She is always intrigued and one of the firsts to ask "what is this", or "why", which helps her gain an understanding of the similarities and differences between others. Maya also has shared her own culture with children through songs and sharing books. She is able to recognize her own culture and how they differ. Maya also has been showing an appreciation for natural environments and how plants and flowers grow. She shows and understanding that they need water to grow just like "us" and what may happen if they don't get water - Maya says "they feel sad and thirsty".

Child's Comments

"I like the sweet potato plant. It has roots and leaves. It stays in the water. Worms are swimming at the bottom. The potato took very long, now it's coming like the sweet potato. We have to put new water because it gets dirty and then it can have a clean bath. I want to plant flowers outside and then use a mug to water the plants to make them happy"

Educator Comments

Maya is a very active within the indoor and outdoor environment. She runs, jumps, dances, climbs and enjoys using the playground equipment. She also enjoys ball play. She has very good eye hand coordination and is able to catch a medium and large size ball with both hands. She also enjoys soccer - able to kick the ball with control and cricket - able to hit the ball using the bat. Maya engages in complex fine motor skills and has developed her finger and hand movements needed for threading, cutting, holding a pencil correctly, using scissors with skill and confidence. Maya also engages in individual experiences and comments of how proud she is when she finishes a task.

Child's Comments

"I love running very fast zoom zoom. I like climbing like a monkey. I like dancing on the dancing mat and jumping like a kangaroo. I hit the ball with my bat and the ball goes over there. I'm Dhoni and now I'm Kholi. Bowl the ball to me so I can hit it very fast. I kick the ball to play soccer. It's very fun"

Learning Outcome 4 - Children are confident and involved learners

"A sense of security and sound wellbeing gives children the confidence to experiment and explore and to try out new ideas, thus developing their competence and becoming active and involved participants in learning"

Goals Achieved

Educator Comments

Maya loves getting involved in different types of experiences that are on offer. She particular has been showing a keen interest in science experiments and discovering what happens when mixing elements together (cause and effect). Maya enjoys hands on experiences and develops an understanding of what is happening and why. She also enjoys solving problems and puts in the effort to think about using a different approach which she hasn't tried previously to see the results.

Child's Comments

"Put soap and water, I used a straw and blew bubbles many bubbles. Little bit of soap not many bubbles but I want more bubbles and we got more soap. I made a volcano with powder and smelly stuff. I put lots of powder and the volcano and I mixed it and then put more smelly stuff and it came out of the bottle. It had small bubbles too."

Educator Comments

Maya what a great conversationalist she has become! Her verbal skills are beyond her development stage and she has the confidence in communicating her thoughts, ideas, wants, needs and feelings with others. She also shows a keen interest for music and is often heard singing songs and chants during her play and interactions. Maya also has developed an interest in using the laptop and is able to perform tasks as turning the laptop on/off, opening Word document, typing her name, using caps lock, using backspace, inserting photos and changing colour of the font. Maya uses technology during her play and often says "Im checking my email" and "Be quiet Im on the phone"

Child's Comments

"Singing makes me happy. I sing Barney songs and different types of songs and silly songs. I use the laptop and I have to be careful so it doesn't break. I do typing. I practice typing with the elephant and the monkey. I have to point and use my left and right finger to find letters. I like to play games on the website. The fish game, the Bingo games, the monster game too. I also have to check my email too. No email today. It's OK."
